## Council & Committee Highlights

### RECREATION COMMITTEE:

### Coaches & Players Code of Conduct:

The Eston & District Recreation Committee approves the Coaches & Players Code of Conduct as a new policy. The Code of Conduct will be implemented for the 2023-2024 hockey season and all sports going forward.

### Baseball Pants:

The Eston & District Recreation Committee approves the change of all baseball & softball pants in Ull age group and higher to be white starting in the 2025 season. Starting 2024 any new pants bought are to be white and in 2025 all pants are to be white.

### Winter KickOff:

The Eston & District Recreation Committee approves the creation of a committee that will start planning a 2023 Winter Kickoff Event.

### Fairground Clean-up:

The Eston & District Recreation Committee would like to proceed with removing the backstops on diamonds 5 & 6, remove row of trees between diamonds 4 and 6, remove power shed, and grade the entire area of diamonds 4, 5, and 6.

This is being done so we can proceed with future plans for building new baseball diamonds in the area.

We would like to ask the RM for their assistance grading, and the Town for help with removing trees and the white shed.

Removing the backstop will be done by the Recreation Committee and volunteers

### Pool Injection

Council accepts the recommendation from the Eston & District Recreation Committee that they accept a quote given by Vector Construction for the Urethane Injection necessary to stop the leaks under the swimming pool pending verification of labor included on the provided quote. Furthermore, they were unable to get other quotes as there are no other companies in the area that offer this service.

### Minor Ball Committee Request

The Eston & District Recreation Committee will set aside \$10 of the registration fee for the T-Ball and U9 age divisions to go towards indoor ball equipment.

### Paint Door Project:

The Eston & District Recreation Committee approves a \$400 arena door project. All doors inside the AGT Community Centre are to be painted blue.
