You will notice a reduction to the WTP Upgrade on your February utility bill. This fee will be reduced to \$10 monthly.

Business Licenses - Council resolved that amendments be made to the Business License Bylaw exempting local businesses from fees.

Overdue Accounts

As of January 1, all overdue accounts receivable (recreation, landfill, etc.) will be charged 2% interest monthly. Anything outstanding end of the year will go on taxes or will be sent to collections.

2023 taxes not paid by December 31, 2023 are now **past due**.

Civic Address Bylaw - January 2024

As of January 1, 2024 - All houses and building require a number. A uniform system of numbering houses and buildings is established and is shown on the tax roll. Each house or building shall bear the number assigned to the frontage on which the front entrance is situated.

House/building numbers will assist emergency personnel, service and delivery companies in locating a property.

Violation of this bylaw will be subject to \$150 fine. If you are unsure of your house/building address, please contact the Town Office.
